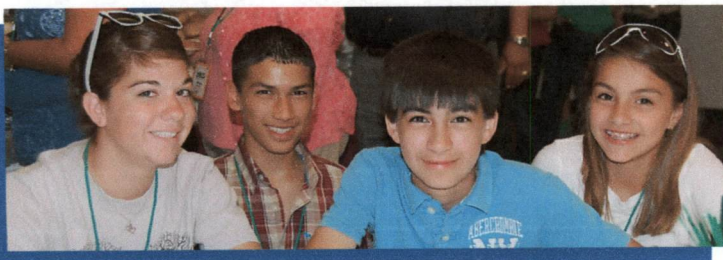

Significant accomplishments

Informed and educated 4H members about Food Show, Food Challenge and Photography contests. 4H Intermediate youth won Red Ribbon at the District 4H Food Show in Laredo, TX. AgriLIFE Extension agent and FCS agent continue to encourage and educate 4H members about 4H events, other than animal projects.

The Maverick County Extension Agents support all the activities of the Adult Leaders, in addition to the original plans of the Maverick County Extension Office. The number of 4-H participants at the Maverick County Junior Livestock Show didn't reflect any significant changes between 2011 and 2012, also for 2013 the validation numbers are very optimistic. The County Extension Agents and the Adult Leaders accomplished several county activities that ended in District 12 competitions such as; Photography, Fashion Show, Story Board, Share the Fun, Record Book, Food Show, and Food Challenge. This year during the summer the County Extension Agent designated the month of July as the 4-H Promotional Month, the 4-H participated at the 4th of July Parade, and the County Extension Office conducted the 4-H Awards Night, to recognize all the 4-H kids that obtained 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place in any of the 4-H competitions, either animal projects or non animal projects. During the summer 4-H banners were placed throughout town to promote the 4-H, we participated at the Back to School Fair of the Eagle Pass ISD, The Border CICLOVIA Health Fair of Eagle Pass, The Kickapoo Health Fair, and the Eagle Pass, Texas Candles for Life. The Maverick County 4-H Council President and Representative Delegate participated at the District 12 Election Convention at Texas A&M Kingsville, they also attended Leadership LAB Camp. All the 4-H Clubs meet once a month, also the Maverick County 4-H Council and the 4-H Club Managers, the meetings cover different important aspects of 4-H.
