January: 13th Annual Falcon Lake Prospect Show was held January 8th and 9th. Approximately 175 entries. Profit from show benefits Zapata County 4-H and ZHS FFA. Path to the Plate Series was kicked off. 3 participants.



February: Zapata County 4-H members participated at the San Angelo Livestock Show and the San Antonio Livestock Show. 10 students exhibited lambs, steers, heifers and competed in the calf scramble. One 4-H member caught a calf in the scramble and will be exhibiting a breeding gilt this year. Horticulture Series kicked off.

March: 1154-H youth participated at the annual Zapata County Fair with nearly \$300K raised at the auction.



April: Earth Day Celebration at Villarreal Elementary. 2nd grade students participated (approximately 100). Students worked to clean up garden beds and planted various vegetables.
