




Webb County 4-H youth council meeting. Nominations have been made and elections are in the process of being made. They have received profession training on parliamentary procedure and have started to plan out events.

(LGEG) in elementary schools in the Laredo Independent School District (LISD). It is expected to have several graduates in 2023. LGEG is 8 week series that will teach students to garden, participate in physical activities, and experience healthy based recipes.

















Covarrubias has started implementing the Growing and Nourishing Healthy Communities (GNHC) at the El Cenizo Community Center in El Cenizo, Texas. Covarrubias is expected to have graduates in the beginning of 2023. GNHC is a 6-week series that targets the adult audience in the community. This series enables adults to learn how to plant and grow fresh fruits and vegetables to have them readily available.





















## Adults Programs

Prairie View A&M Cooperative Extension Family & Community Health Extension Agent Genesis Hernandez joined the organization in May 2022 and delivered adult programming to Ladrillera Activity Center named A Taste of Latin Heritage as well as one shots of Balanced Living, a mindfulness centered curriculum to after school coordinators and support staff at UISD and TMC EI Lago Head Start Center in Zapata, Texas. Balanced Living sessions was also offered to Casa Misericordia.

### Youth Programs

Youth programming was emphasized this year. Character Building was the main theme as 2 different curriculums were offered: Building a Culture of Kindness and Take a Stand, a 4-H curriculum. These programs were offered to UISD after school adventures programs as well as Southwest Key Las Promesas Program. Teen Cuisine, a SNAP-Ed curriculum teaching teens knife skills and general nutrition was also offered at Southwest Key Las Promesas Program.

## Professional Development

As the new Family & Community Health Agent for Prairie View A&M CEP, Genesis Hernandez was able to attend the Association of Extension Agents Systemwide Conference. Through this conference, Hernandez was able to learn about relevant health trends, successful program outcome stories and the history of land-grant universities.
