County Collaborations:

2023 Private Water Well Screening

On April 19-20, 2023 Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service of Atascosa, Dimmit, Frio, McMullen, LaSalle, and Zavala Counties hosted a Multi-County Water Well Screening. This gives well owners an opportunity to test for fecal coliform bacteria, nitrate levels, high salinity, and hydrocarbons.

We had a total of **17 water samples** and **3** for Dimmit County.



On August 2, 2023 Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service of Dimmit County partnered with AgriLife Extension Wildlife Specialist Dr. Jacob Dykes and Texas Parks & Wildlife Health Specialist Kory Gann to host a chronic wasting disease workshop for landowners. Attendees were educated on the biology of CWD, management strategies, and current status in Texas. There was a total of **35 landowners** in attendance.



Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service in Dimmit County hosted a training on March 29, 2023. The three-hour training gives participants needed information to take the private applicator license test which is administered by the Texas Department of Agriculture.



4-H and Youth Development

<u>Dimmit County 4-H Outreach:</u> Dimmit County 4-H Clubs, adult volunteers, and County Extension Agents participated in community outreach and community service events throughout the year. These monthly events provide club members an opportunity to recruit, speak with youth, and inform them of what the Dimmit County 4-H Program has to offer.

FAMILY & COMMUNITY HEALTH

2023 Dimmit County



A total of **200** youth and adults participated in Family and Community Health programs in Dimmit County. Participants gained knowledge nutritious meals, stretch their food resources, improve their food safety practices, and participate in regular physical activity.

Face to face programs were held with Passenger Safety Kids Initiative, Dimmit County Wesley Nurse, The Dimmit County Wellness Coalition, The Dimmit County Judge and Elected officials, Dimmit County Public Library, Carrizo Springs CISD, Kids R First daycare, and First United Methodist Church, La Paloma Senior Center, and Girl Scouts Troop #5105.

Collaborations:

A county collaboration with Family and Community Health Agent Carissa Munoz and The Dimmit Wellness Coalition hosted a Back-to-School Healthcare Event held that served **800 students**, with the assistance **of 57 agencies** to provide school supplies and health information for Dimmit County.

A collaboration with Texas A&M AgriLife Passenger Safety Initiatives and TXDOT occurred on June 30, 2023. The proper use of child safety seats reduces the risk of injury and death, leading to reduced medical costs, avoidance of lost future earnings, and improved quality of life. These economic benefits are an estimated \$2,859 per child age 0 to 4 and \$3,250 per child age 4 to 7 for new seats distributed, and \$766 per child for seat misuse corrected with an assumed 75% continued use. Based on this formula, the total **economic impact for the Dimmit County Inspections in 2023 is \$32,618.**
