
Youth Council Kickoff Meeting

Upcoming Agriculture & Natural Resources Programs



Extension Agent, Aileen Sifuentes, conducted a total of 11 youth programs in Webb County which amounted to a total of 354 graduates. Elementary schools such as Centeno Elementary, Prada Elementary, Roosevelt Elementary, and Ligarde Elementary participated in Balancing Food & Play, Choose Healthy, Learn, Grow, Eat, & Go!, and Early Childhood Learn, Grow, Eat, & Go! to learn about the importance of nutrition and physical activity as well as introductions to gardening and plant science. A community support agency, Las Promesas de Laredo-part of Southwest Key Programs, participated in Balancing Food & Play and Walk N Talk Youth during their summer school break.







Extension Agent, Aileen Sifuentes, conducted a total of 11 adult programs for year 2022-2023. There was three Fresh Start to a Healthier You! programs with a total of **25 graduates**. A Be Well, Live Well program had a total of **7 graduates**. A Get the Facts program had a total of **8 graduates**. There were two Healthy Carbohydrates programs with **13 graduates** and finally, three Walk N Talk programs with **10 graduates**.

Fresh Start to a Healthier You This program was implemented in Fred and Anita Community Center. From 10 participants that attended 5 were graduates.



Healthy Carbohydrates

This program was implemented at Honore Ligarde Elementary; 6 participants that attended 3 were graduates.



Fresh Start to a Healthier You

This program was implemented in the Webb County Agricultural office partnering with the Webb County Maintenance. From 20 participants that attended 10 were graduates.



Be Well Live Well
This program was implemented in Ladrillera Community Center.
From 18 participants that attended 12 were graduates.



Be Well Live Well

This program was implemented in Fasken Senior Center. From 15 participants that attended 8 were graduates.



Early Childhood Learn, Grow, Eat, & Go!

Early Childhood LGEG is a 4 session series that exposes kindergarten aged children to new vegetables and physical activities through gardening. This year, Ms. Cynthia Covarrubias obtained 97 graduates from Ligarde Elementary (Laredo ISD) and Prada Elementary (United ISD).









Learn, Grow, Eat, & Go! Is 10 session series that promotes nutrition and active living through gardening. Elementary aged youth were able to build garden beds, maintain their vegetable plants, and taste healthy recipes that include the vegetables growing in the garden. Ms. Cynthia Covarrubias obtained 234 graduate through the collaboration with Laredo ISD (Ligarde Elementary) and United ISD Federal and State Programs (Fasken,

Borchers, Arndt, Kennedy-Zapata, Centeno,

and Perez elementary schools).





















Growing and Nourishing Healthy Communities

Growing and Nourishing Healthy Communities (GNHC) is a 6 session series for adults that teaches the basics of constructing a vegetable garden to increase vegetable accessibility and increase physical activity through gardening. Ms. Cynthia Covarrubias implemented GNHC at different locations with the collaboration of the Webb County Community Centers, City of Laredo Recreation Centers, and United ISD Family Matters Resource Center. Ms. Covarrubias was able to receive 70 graduates from this program.
